Earlier, Board members sent an email to the membership stating their opposition to the Endorsement of President Trump.

As the President representing the majority, I would like to address their concerns.

- 1. The endorsement was made following the current endorsement policy which has been in place for the last 5 years along with PAC monetary donations. Which is by a majority executive board vote. In the oppositions letter, a board member who voted yes is now stating he is against the endorsement. Let me remind you, Board members are also supposed to abide by the majority as per our oath of office.
- 2. They state the negative effects of the endorsement amongst our friends and allies in the community will have an impact on our effectiveness to advance the needs of our membership.

What they are not saying is, the positive effects of our endorsement will outweigh any hurt feelings from our so-called friends and allies. As we are now gaining favor with Republican State legislators who are in control of ACT 111, which is our collective bargaining rights. And also note that our so-called friends Democratic Legislators are now attacking Act 111, with their desire to go after police unions.

We will also have direct line to the Whitehouse to help maximize Federal Grants to the city, and begin a partnership similar to what the National FOP has, with them addressing our issues.
